The Company was incorporated on 25th January, 2022 under the Companies Act, 2013 as a wholly owned subsidiary of PFC Consulting Limited (PFCCL), which is a wholly owned subsidiary of Power Finance Corporation Ltd (PFC Ltd.), a Govt. of India Undertaking.

Further, as per Para 3.5 of Tariff Based Competitive Bidding Guidelines for Transmission Service (TBCB guidelines) dated 10.08.2021, in case the bidding process for a transmission scheme is cancelled/de-notified, the expenditure incurred on that scheme may be recovered when the scheme is re-bid. In case the scheme is no longer required or given on regulated tariff mechanism, the expenditure incurred on that scheme may be allocated to upcoming schemes with the permission of Ministry of Power (MoP). PFCCL has sought approval of MoP for allocation of expenditure to upcoming scheme vide letter dated 17.04.2025.

Therefore, as per TBCB guidelines, the entire expenditure incurred on the scheme (capitalized as "CWIP" till 31.03.2024) is considered as "Recoverable under TBCB guidelines" and MoP vide letter dated 12.09.2025 has given its permission to allocate the expenditure incurred on the scheme to the upcoming scheme.

In view of the above, the Company has discontinued its business and management of the Company have intended to wind up/liquidate the affairs of the company itself.

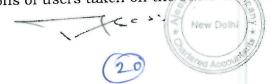

Corporate Information

. Chhatarpur Transmission Limited "the Company" was incorporated on 25th January 2022 under the Companies Act, 2013, as a wholly owned subsidiary of PFC Consulting Limited "PFCCL", which is a wholly owned subsidiary of Power Finance Corporation Ltd (PFC Ltd), a Govt. of India undertaking. The registered office of the Company is located at 'Urjanidhi', 1, Barakhamba Lane, Connaught Place, New Delhi-110001. The company has been incorporated to develop "Transmission system for evacuation of power from Chhatarpur SEZ (1500MW)" for the selection of transmission service provider.

Material Accounting Policy Information

a. Basis of Preparation and Statement of Compliance

These financial statements have been prepared on historical cost and accrual basis of accounting and are in compliance with the Indian Accounting Standards (referred to as "Ind AS") notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 (as amended) and applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013. The financial statements has not been prepared on a going concern basis. All the assets have been carried at their net realisable value and liabilities have been stated at the value at which they are expected to be settled.

The Company's financial statements are presented in Indian Rupees (INR), which is its functional currency.

Amounts in these financial statements have been rounded off to 'nearest hundreds upto two decimal points (unless otherwise indicated).

b. Use of Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of revenue, expense, assets and liabilities and disclosures relating to contingent liabilities on the date of the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revision to accounting estimates is recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised and in any future period affected.

c. Recognition of Income / Expenditure

Income and expenses (except otherwise stated) are accounted for on accrual basis.

d. Capital Work in Progress

Expenditure incurred on Consultancy /Administration /Interest /Manpower Charges/ Legal & Professional etc. during construction period/setting up of project (net of incomes) is capitalized and treated as Capital Work In Progress.

e. Expenditure incurred by Holding Company

Expenditure incurred by the company for the Project is funded by the Holding Company (PFCCL) and is considered as Borrowings and disclosed under the head Current Liabilities. Interest is charged by holding company (PFCCL) as per rate applicable from time

f. Preliminary Expenses

Preliminary expenses has been charged to the Statement of Profit & Loss in the year in which such expenditure has been incurred.

Borrowing Costs

Borrowing cost is charged to the Statement of Profit & Loss for the year in which it is incurred except for capital work in progress which is capitalized till the date of commercial use of the assets.

h. Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets

- (i) Provisions are recognised when the Company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, if it is probable that the Company will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. The amount recognised as a provision is the best estimate of the consideration required to settle the present obligation at the end of the reporting period, taking into account the risks and uncertainties surrounding the obligation. When some or all of the economic benefits required to settle a provision are expected to be recovered from a third party, a receivable is recognised as an asset if it is virtually certain that reimbursement will be received and the amount of the receivable can be measured reliably.
- (ii) Where it is not probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required or the amount cannot be estimated reliably, the obligation is disclosed as contingent liability in notes to accounts, unless the probability of outflow of economic benefits is remote.
- (iii) Contingent Assets are not recognised in the financial statements but are disclosed, where an inflow of economic benefit is

i. Cash & Cash Equivalents

Cash comprises cash on hand and demand deposits. The Company considers cash equivalents as all short term balances (with an original maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition), highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

j. Cash Flow Statement

Cash flow Statement is prepared in accordance with the indirect method, whereby net profit/(loss) before tax is adjusted for the effects of transactions of a non-cash nature and any deferrals or accruals of past or future cash receipts or payments. The cash flows from operating, investing and financing activities of the company are segregated.

k. Taxes on Income

Income Tax expense comprises of current and deferred tax. It is recognised in Statement of Profit and Loss, except when it relates to an item that is recognised in OCI or directly in equity, in which case, tax is also recognised in OCI or directly in equity.

Current tax is the expected tax payable on taxable income for the year, using tax rates enacted or substantively enacted and as applicable at the reporting date, and any adjustments to tax payable in respect of Previous Years.

Deferred tax is recognised on temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the financial statements and the corresponding tax bases used in the computation of taxable income. Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates based on the laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset if there is a legally enforceable right to offset current tax liabilities and assets, and they relate to income taxes levied by the same tax authority.

A deferred tax liability is recognised for all taxable temporary differences. A deferred tax asset is recognized for all deductible temporary differences to the extent that it is probable that taxable profits will be available against which the deductible temporary difference can be utilized. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each reporting date and are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that the related tax benefit will be realized.

I. Financial Instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the

On initial recognition, financial assets and financial liabilities are recognised at fair value plus/ minus transaction cost that are attributable to the acquisition or issue of financial assets and financial liabilities. In case of financial assets and financial liabilities which are recognised at fair value through profit and loss (FVTPL), it's transaction costs are recognised in Statement of Profit and Loss.

A Financial Assets

All regular way purchases or sales of financial assets are recognised and derecognised on a settlement date basis. After initial recognition, financial assets are subsequently measured in their entirety at either amortised cost or fair value, depending on the classification of the financial assets.

i) Classification and Measurement of Financial Assets (other than Equity instruments)

Financial assets that meet the following conditions are subsequently measured at amortised cost using Effective Interest Rate

• the asset is held within a business model whose objective is to hold assets in order to collect contractual cash flows; and

• the contractual terms of the asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are Solely Payments of Principal and Interest (SPPI) on the principal amount outstanding.

b) Financial Assets at Fair Value through Other Comprehensive Income (FVTOC!)

A financial asset is measured at FVTOCI if both the following conditions are met:

• The objective of the business model is achieved both by collecting contractual cash flows and selling the financial asset; and

• the contractual terms of the asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are Solely Payments of Principal and Interest (SPPI) on the principal amount outstanding.

c) Financial Assets at fair value through Profit or Loss (FVTPL)

A financial asset is measured at FVTPL unless it is measured at amortised cost or FVTOCI, with all changes in fair value recognised in Statement of Profit and Loss.

ii) Impairment of Financial Assets

a) Subsequent to initial recognition, the Company recognises expected credit loss (ECL) on financial assets measured at amortised cost. ECL on such financial assets, other than loan assets, is measured at an amount equal to life time expected losses. The impairment requirements for the recognition and measurement of ECL are equally applied to Loan asset at FVTOCI except that ECL is recognised in other comprehensive income and is not reduced from the carrying amount in the balance sheet.

b) Impairment of Loan Assets and commitments under Letter of Comfort (LoC):

The Company measures ECL on loan assets at an amount equal to the lifetime ECL if there is credit impairment or there has been significant increase in credit risk (SICR) since initial recognition. If there is no SICR as compared to initial recognition, the Company measures ECL at an amount equal to 12-month ECL. When making the assessment of whether there has been a SICR since initial recognition, the Company considers reasonable and supportable information, that is available without undue cost or effort. If the Company measured loss allowance as lifetime ECL in the previous period, but determines in a subsequent period that there has been no SICR since initial recognition due to improvement in credit quality, the Company again measures the loss allowance based on 12-month ECL. ECL is measured on individual basis for credit impaired loan assets, and on other loan assets it is generally measured on collective basis using homogenous groups.

c) The impairment losses and reversals are recognised in Statement of Profit and Loss.

iii) De-recognition of Financial Assets

The Company derecognises a financial asset when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the asset expire, or when it transfers the financial asset and substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of the asset to another party. On de-recognition of a financial asset in its entirety, the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the sum of the consideration received and receivable, and the cumulative gain or loss that had been recognised in other comprehensive income and accumulated in equity, is recognised in Statement of Profit and Loss if such gain or loss would have otherwise been recognised in Statement of Profit and Loss on disposal of that financial asset.

B Financial Liabilities

i) All financial liabilities other than derivatives and financial guarantee contracts are subsequently measured at amortised cost EIR is determined at the initial recognition of the financial liability. EIR is subsequently updated for financial liabilities having

floating interest rate, at the respective reset date, in accordance with the terms of the respective contract.

The Company derecognises financial liabilities when, and only when, the Company's obligations are discharged, cancelled or have expired. The difference between the carrying amount of the financial liability derecognised and the consideration paid and payable is recognised in Statement of Profit and Loss.

(m) Earnings Per Share

Basic earnings per share are computed by dividing the net profit after tax by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period. Diluted earnings per shares is computed by dividing the profit after tax by the weighted average number of equity shares considered for deriving basic earnings per shares and also the weighted average number of equity shares that could have been issued upon conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares.

However, in view of MoP decision as disclosed in Note-31, expenditure capitalised till 31.03.2024 alongwith expenditure incurred during the year (refer Note-11), except audit fee, have been transferred to "Recoverable under TBCB guidelines".
- 17 The expenses are mainly allocated by PECCL to CHHATARPUR TRANSMISSION LIMITED. Direct Expenditures related to ITP are allocated on 100% basis and common expenditure are allocated based on sharing of services between various ITPs. Original supporting bills in respect of such expenditure incurred by the PFCCL are in the name of PECCL and retained by them of which copies are available with the company. In case the scheme is no longer required or given on regulated tariff mechanism, the expenditure incurred on that scheme may be allocated to upcoming schemes with the permission of Ministry of Power. PFCL has sought approval of MoP for allocation of expenditure to upcoming scheme vide letter dated 17 April 2025. Therefore as per TBCB guidelines, the entire expenditure incurred on the scheme (capitalised as "CWIP" till 31 March 2024) is considered as "Recoverable under TBCB guidelines" and MoF vide letter dated 12.09.2025 has given its permission to allocate the expenditure incurred on the "Transmission Scheme for Evacuation of Power from Chhatarpur SEZ (1500 MW)" to the upcoming "Transmission System for Evacuation of Power

In view of the above, the Company has discontinued its business and management of the Company have intended to wind up/liquidate the affairs of the Company itself. Accordingly, these financial statements have not been prepared on a going concern basis. Further, all assets and liabilities have been measured and stated at the values they expect to be realized.
